

NOTES FOR WINTER 2010 COURSES

(Updated: October 30, 2009)

Most courses will be filled on a first come, first served basis. Note that since all courses have a limited capacity (whether due to classroom size or the nature of the course), students are strongly advised to **register early** to increase their chances of getting the courses they want. When registering in a course that has more than one section (e.g., Intro Greek or Hebrew), students should indicate a second choice in case their first choice is full.

CREDIT VALUE: All courses are for 3 credit/audit hours only, unless otherwise indicated. Students who audit a variable credit course will register for the lowest number of credit hours for that course.

PREREQUISITES (Pre) & RECOMMENDED PREREQUISITES (REC): Students who lack a required prerequisite (Pre) for a course will only be permitted to register for that course if they can provide the instructor's written permission. Students who lack a recommended prerequisite (Rec) will be permitted to register, but they should be prepared to do additional work in the course.

Note: Biblical Exegesis & Interpretation (BIBL 503) requires some knowledge of both Hebrew and Greek. For students who have taken Introductory Hebrew or Greek rather than LANG 500 (Perspectives), basic study notes are available for gaining some familiarity with the other language (see the Schedules & Forms page of the College website).

PRIORITY ENROLLMENT COURSES: The courses listed below are each required for a program and have a priority enrollment due to the nature of the course (seminars typically have a maximum of 12 students). **Students wanting to take any of these courses must register by the early registration deadline of December 18, 2009 and attach a *Priority Enrollment Course Request Form* (available at Student Services and on the College website) to their *Winter Registration Form*.** Class lists will be determined within two weeks after December 18th, and will be posted on our website under Academic Info, Schedules and Forms. Students who need a course for the program to which they have been admitted, and who have registered by the early registration deadline, will be given first priority. Note that courses numbered 700 or higher are for more advanced students and that seminars in particular are not available to auditors.

CHRISTIAN THOUGHT & CULTURE II (INDS 502): Students who took CTC I (INDS 501) in the Fall term are asked to remain in their same tutorial section for CTC II (INDS 502) in the Winter term. Students who must change tutorial sections due to an unavoidable scheduling conflict (based on the tutorial schedule listed below) will need to appeal to the CTC Administrative TA by email: ctcadmin2009@gmail.com. Students newly admitted in the Winter term are advised to wait until the subsequent Fall & Winter term to begin taking Christian Thought & Culture I & II. **However, new students who decide to take CTC II for credit in Winter term must submit a *CTC II Tutorial Request Form* with their *Winter Registration Form* by the early registration deadline (December 18, 2009), indicating their preferences among the following twelve tutorial sections:**

MDiv SOUL OF MINISTRY / SUPERVISED MINISTRY: All newly-admitted MDiv students, and returning MDiv students who did not complete Soul of Ministry (APPL 500) in a previous year, should plan to register for **Soul of Ministry (APPL 500; 3 credits) in Winter Term 2010**. Returning MDiv students who completed the first half of Supervised Ministry (APPL 690; 1.5 cr.) in Fall Term 2009 should register for the second half of **Supervised Ministry (APPL 690; 1.5 credits)**, which meets on Jan 11 & 25, Feb 8, Mar 1, 15, & 29.

MCS FIELD EDUCATION (APPL 691) / MCS MARKETPLACE FIELD IMMERSION (APPL 692): **MCS Field Education (APPL 691; 1.5 cr.)**, which began in the Fall term, continues in the Winter term with a Practicum & 4 remaining class sessions on Jan 11, Feb 8, Mar 8, & Apr 12. **MCS Marketplace Field Immersion (APPL 692; 1.5 cr.)**, which likewise began in the Fall term, continues in the Winter term as students continue in their Practicum.

NON-CREDIT COURSES:

Major Project Orientation: The Thesis Orientation (GENR 301) meets on Jan 11, 18, 25, Feb 1, and costs \$35; the Integrative Project in the Arts and Theology Orientation (GENR 313) meets on Jan 15th and has no charge.

Academic Writing: (GENR 311; 0 cr.) meets on Jan 15, from 1:00-4:00; & Jan 16, from 9:00-4:00, and costs \$35.
